It's been five years since my co-founders and I joined forces with a goal of developing a cadre of high-impact young entrepreneurs for Canada. Today, amid the deluge of interest in entrepreneurship, and the fashion for accelerators and incubators, The Next 36 represents a unique value proposition.

As our alumni and programs mature, it will be satisfying for all of us who have touched them, to see our entrepreneurs tackle some of the toughest international challenges with the tools we have given them. That should be their goal, as it is ours at The Next 36.

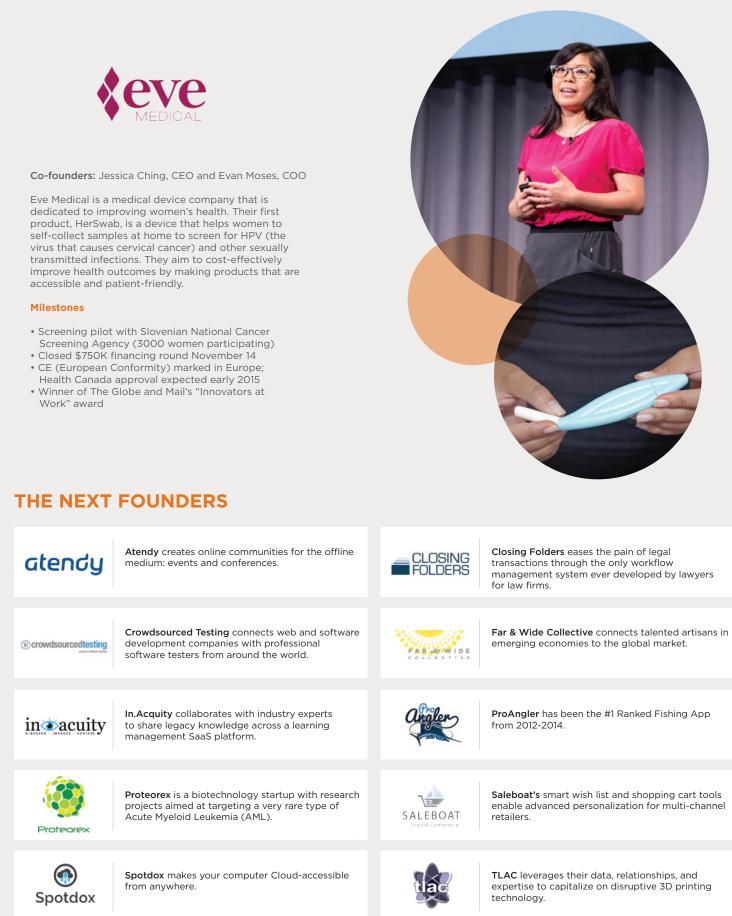

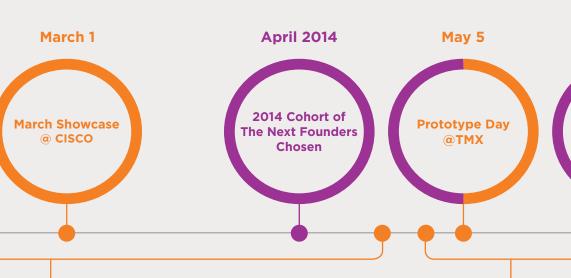

The Next 36 is an eight-month program that provides a select group of 36 undergraduates and recent grads with a unique combination of education, mentorship and up to \$95,000 in seed investment to launch a new business.

All entrepreneurs arrive in Toronto at the beginning of May. Those in The Next 36 live with their co-founders and build their venture 24/7. The Next Founders curriculum is tailored to suit their venture with more optional classes and workshops.

The Entrepreneurship Institute consists of in-class instruction taught by internationally acclaimed faculty and Canadian business leaders delivering courses important to entrepreneurs from all academic backgrounds.

It also includes workshops on venture finance, sales, negotiation, marketing and project management and provides frequent access to Canadian business leaders, who often become advisors and connectors for our entrepreneurs.

Young entrepreneurs attend over a dozen exclusive networking events and pitch continuously throughout the summer, leading to Venture Day, where they present to investors from across North America.

INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT

To the Directors of The Next 36

The accompanying summary financial statements, which comprise the summary statement of financial position as at August 31, 2014 and the summary statement of operations and changes in net assets for the year then ended, and related note, are derived from the audited financial statements of The Next 36 for the year ended August 31, 2014. We expressed an unmodified audit opinion on those financial statements in our report dated December 2, 2014. Those financial statements, and the summary financial statements, do not reflect the effects of events that occurred subsequent to the date of our report on those financial statements.

The summary financial statements do not contain all the disclosures required by Canadian accounting standards for not-for-profit organizations (ASNPO). Reading the summary financial statements, therefore, is not a substitute for reading the audited financial statements of The Next 36.
